WOMEN IN POLITICS

The joint legislative committee for the Woman's Eight Hour Bill has decided to present to the 1913 legislature a bill providing that the present 10 hour law shall be changed by substituting the numeral "8" instead of "10," which now appears therein.

Twenty-five states limit the hours of employment of women more than Illinois does. In fact the backward position of Illinois has led the legislature to authorize the Illinois Industrial Survey. One of the doctors on this commission in a speech on the Physiological Basis for Shorter Working Day for Women says: "If individuals and firms are so lacking in their social development that they are willing to sacrifice women to industrial advantage, and where as in Illinois the legislature is unsatisfactory and inadequate, then organized society must take action."

It is significant that not until women came into their rights as citizens were these various welfare matters taken up through our legislative bodies to any extent.

It has rarely been the privilege of a whole people of a state to have a hand in the formation of the constitution under which they live and to have it presented to them for their rejection or acceptance. In other lands constitutions are made by the few and become the law of the land whether acceptable or not to the popular will.

Illinois being strongly Republican it was natural that the G. O. P. predominated in the membership of the Constitution Convention and all officers of the convention were members of that party. The revised constitution of 1922 was adopted by the convention at Springfield on June 20th of this year and will be submitted to the people on December 12th, 1922.

The following section 132 determines who shall vote under the Article on Suffrage and Election:

Section 132—Excepting only idiots and persons adjudged insane or convicted of infamous crime and not restored to civil rights, every citizen of the United States above the age of twenty-one years who has resided in the state one year and (unless naturalized because of military or naval service) in the United States five years, shall be a qualified elector. He may vote only in the election district and county in which he has resided thirty and ninety days respectively next before such election.
