

**NEW CONSTITUTION
DISCUSSED MONDAY
AT PEOPLES FORUM**

Several Sections Held to be Detrimental to the People — Next Meeting Oct. 16.

At the meeting of the People's Forum in Library Hall, Monday evening the first Article of the proposed new state constitution was analyzed and commented upon. Three sections were criticised. In section seven it was held that by eliminating the provision of the present constitution that all persons shall be bailable, except in certain capital cases, the section becomes dangerous in its possible applications.

In section eight, by restricting the absolute necessity of indictment to one class of crimes, namely capital, and by permitting the attorney general to prosecute by information without leave and without having to show probable cause the section becomes a menace to the liberty of the people.

Section thirteen of the present constitution provides that the fee of land taken from owners without their consent for railroad tracks shall remain in those owners subject to the use for which it is taken. The proposed constitution eliminates this paragraph. In the People's Forum it was contended that only such property in land should be taken as is necessary for the use. When a right of way is no longer used by a railroad the land should revert to the owner or his heirs.

Section nineteen was considered by the Forum as a glaring and unnecessary appeal to the negro voters of Chicago.
