Sealed bids will be received by the Village Council performing the duties of the Board of Local Improvements for the Village of Downers Grove, DuPage County, Illinois, until eight o'clock p. m. on the 30th day of October, 1922, for furnishing all material and labor and constructing extensions to the present water pipe system in the Village of Downers Grove, DuPage County, Illinois, in accordance with the ordinances, plans and specifications providing for such improvement and now on file with the Village Clerk of said Village.

The estimated quantities of material are as follows:
SPECIAL ASSESSMENT NO. 64
3050 feet of 6 inch cast iron water pipe.
2092 feet of 4 inch cast iron water pipe.

11 fire hydrants.
4 6-inch double gate valves.

Proposals must be made out on blank forms furnished by said Village Council and in compliance with the instructions and specifications. The bidder to whom the work is awarded shall be required to furnish a bond, as required by law, and any bidder, when required by said Council, shall furnish them with satisfactory evidence that he has the necessary facilities, experience, ability, and financial resources to fulfill the conditions of his contract within the time specified.

Payment for all work will be made by special assessment bonds bearing interest at the rate of 6% per annum, which bonds shall be taken by the contractor at par.
