Minutes of the meeting of October 2, 1922 were read and Commissioner Heatt moved to approve same. On roll call Commissioners Heatt, Haller, Bryce and Mayor Barber voted Aye. Nays none. Motion carried.

An ordinance entitled "An Ordinance amending Paragraph Two of Section One of an ordinance entitled 'SIDEWALKS' known as Chapter XLIII of the general ordinances of the Village of Downers Grove" and an ordinance entitled "An Ordinance providing an additional section to be known as Paragraph Seventeen, to an ordinance entitled 'WATER SYSTEM AND MATTERS RELATING

THERETO," known as Chapter XLVII, of the general ordinances of the Village of Downers Grove" were presented and read and same were ordered held for final passage on October 16, 1922.
