AN ORDINANCE

Providing an additional section, to be known as Paragraph Seventeen, to an Ordinance entitled "WATER SYSTEM AND MATTERS RELATING THERETO," known as Chapter XLVII, of the General Ordinances of the Village of Downers Grove.

Be it ordained by the Council of the Village of Downers Grove, DuPage County, Illinois:

SECTION SEVENTEEN. Whenever application shall hereafter be made for a permit for the laying of sewer and water mains that are to be connected with the sewer and water pipe systems of said village, the water pipe or pipes may be laid in the same ditch with the sewer pipes, providing, however, that no water pipe shall be placed in any ditch provided for and used for sewer connections, unless the said water pipe shall be at least five (5) feet below the surface of the ground. The water pipes shall be placed immediately above the sewer pipe and resting on dirt firmly tamped at least six (6) inches above the center of the sewer pipe and sufficient allowance shall be made to prevent the water pipe from breaking due to settling.

SECTION 18. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with Section 17, of the above entitled Ordinance, are hereby repealed.

SECTION 19. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and publication.

AN ORDINANCE

Amending Paragraph Two, of Section One, of an Ordinance entitled "SIDEWALKS," known as Chapter XLIII, of the General Ordinances of the Village of Downers Grove.

Be it ordained by the Council of the Village of Downers Grove, Illinois:

SECTION 1. That Paragraph Two of an Ordinance entitled "SIDEWALKS," Chapter XLIII, of the revised General Ordinances of the Village of Downers Grove, be amended to read as follows:

Foundations for said cement sidewalks shall be prepared by bringing the space to be occupied by the sidewalk to a grade twelve inches below the grade fixed by the Street Commissioner for each sidewalk hereafter built. When necessary, the sub-foundation must be consolidated by wetting and ramming to give the proper solidity. Soft and spongy ground of grass or vegetable matter or sod must be dug out and the place refilled with solid material. Upon the sub-grade, twelve inches below the established grade, shall be placed a foundation of cinders. Said foundation shall not be less than seven inches thick and as wide as the width of said sidewalk, after being flooded and thoroughly rammed with tools made for that purpose. Upon said foundation of cinders, as aforesaid, the surface of which foundation of cinders shall be of five inches below the finished grade, there shall be laid a layer of cement concrete four inches thick and as wide as the width of said sidewalk throughout the en-

tire length of said sidewalk, provided that whenever the Council of the Village of Downers Grove is of the opinion that any such sidewalk can safely and efficiently be constructed without the use of cinders, as provided herein, a permit may be granted for the construction of the sidewalk, notwithstanding the above requirements in respect to the use of cinders. Whenever any such permit shall be issued the permit shall state that the use of cinders for the construction of said sidewalk has been waived by the Village Council and the permit shall contain the Mayor's signature under such statement. Any such permit shall be void unless so endorsed.

SECTION 14. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval, and after its passage and approval.
