WOMEN IN POLITICS

Iceland recently elected its first
woman to the upper house of the
Althing, Mme. Ingeborg Bjarnason tak-
ing her seat in Parliament on Septem-
ber 19 of this year.

The election of a woman in Iceland is not a matter of surprise be-
cause that country has been singularly free of that prejudice to the
woman movement which so many of
the more important countries have
displayed.

Iceland as far back as 1609 passed
a law forbidding warfare and the use
of arms and has maintained that law
to the present day.

There is no public office that is not
open to women from that of Bishop
to the Judge of the high courts and
this is largely on account of the active
interest women have always taken
in public affairs in the land of long winters.

The work of popularizing the study
of government for the 25,000,000
women voters in the United States,
is being carried forward by the
League of Women Voters which is
now preparing a book on the Science
of Governing to be issued to its more
than 5,000 branches in every state
of the union.
