Tuberculosis and Public Health Program of Tuberculosis Society for Year 1923

The objective of public health work is the prevention of the occurrence and recurrence of preventable disease, and to give the necessary relief to those afflicted. The preventive feature of the work lessens the problem; the relief features alleviates the suffering.

Without preventive effort our relief work will be constantly present and will increase with our growing population.

The work of our tuberculosis society in the past year has been a study of the general public health problem, and of the organizations thru which this work is conducted and a study of the public health situation as it exists in our county.

Pertaining to the general problem and revealed with startling distinctness are two facts:

(1) That the fundamental departments or branches of public health work consisting of child welfare, infant welfare, visiting or community nursing and tuberculosis work, are so intimately and inseparably related, that only well directed and coordinated effort can produce in each branch that degree of effectiveness which is necessary and merited.

(2) This coordinate effort is best obtained by centralizing the forces of education, development and execution in one individual or in a small compact organization.

**Local Public Health Situation**

A survey made by the tuberculosis society of more than one sixth of the school population of this county has revealed the physical condition of our school children and this constitutes a most acute problem.

A tuberculosis survey of the entire county reveals the existence of this disease in the same dread proportion as it exists thruout the country as a whole.

Again, the county situation presents two main outstanding facts:

(1) relief work insufficiently developed thru preventive work lacking or at a minimum; (2) no organized directing and coordinating power.

**The 1923 Program Enlarges**

(1) Preventive work must be developed;

(2) Relief work increased and made more effective;

(3) And of the greatest importance, we must provide for the maintenance of a thoroly qualified, experienced and full-time public health worker whose duties will be in the field of education, development and intelligent coordination and execution of the essential branches of public health work.


