In connection with the giving out of the honor roll students it may be interesting to compare the grading of the local high schools with that of other schools throughout the country. Among other things, it has been said that the local school grades students too low. Let us compare this with the facts.

The normal average of grades throughout the country, according to the general educational survey, last year, was as follows: A's—7%; B's—24%; C's—38%; D's—24%.

The grades as given out in the local school this semester are: A's—10%; B's—29%; C's—34%; D's—20%.

It must be remembered that the normal average is not that of a small group of schools from one section or one state but are taken from an average of schools all over the country. This would seem to indicate that the Downers Grove high school is rather close to the national average and even a little higher.

**DUPAGE COUNTY HOLSTEIN MAKES 1026 lb. RECORD**

Animal Owned by Rathbun Boys, of Lombard, in Highest Record at Testing Plant.

We have just been advised that the cow Laura Madrigal Sarcastic Lad, owned by John K. Rathbun's two oldest sons of Lombard, has completed her yearly record at the Holstein Testing plant at Dixon with a record of 1026.03 pounds butter and 26290.1 pounds milk. This we believe, is the second thousand pound cow in DuPage and the 12th Holstein in the state.

She made this record as a 11 year old cow. She is a large, fine individual and has several offspring in the Rathbun herd. This is the highest record in both milk and butter yet made at the Testing Plant.
