1. Shepherd Towner bill.
  2. Eight hour day for women.
  3. Jury service for women.

  6. Immigration problem.

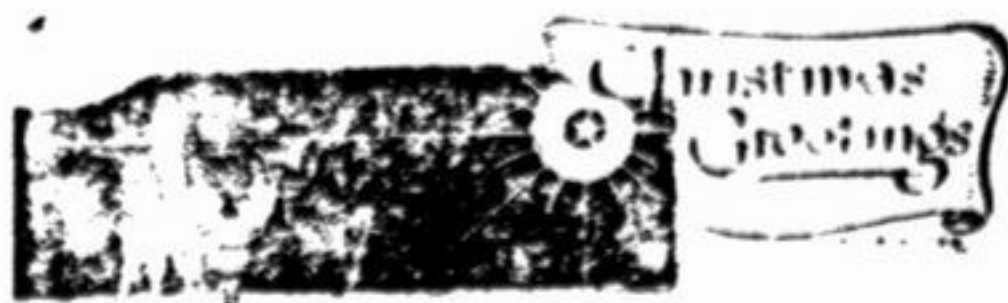
