Personal telephone calls are found to be very effective, and when Bogarttown had difficulty in getting members through a general announcement, a committee was appointed to give personal invitations. The result was most successful. For years White Lake Institute felt that the district was too sparsely settled to muster up enough women to take a course; then they decided they were missing something so they went to work and had an attendance of thirty-six at a two-day Foods course.

Everyone appreciates what the local leaders of Girls' Homemaking Clubs are doing to promote homemaking education for rural girls. Appreciation is also due the Institutes that sponsor clubs and support the leader, as, for example, in providing funds to cover expenses incident to her work, such as the cost of materials for a demonstration on "Meat in the Menu." (Sometimes the club members meet these expenses but this plan is not always desirable.) Many branches supply attractive luncheons for club members' Achievement Days. Where there is no county grant some Institutes provide club pins. In certain districts Institutes have helped a lot by providing transportation to Achievement Days
