A T THE Annual Meeting of the Ontario Division of the Canadian Mental Health Association held in Toronto on May 4th, Sir Ellsworth Flavelle, the President of the Ontario Division, spoke as follows:

(4) Having mental health specialists present at Area Meetings for consultation on program planning.

(5) Provision upon request of mental health materials (charts, posters and pamphlets) for work with teachers, parents and children.

(6) Provision of an Information Service at 111 St. George Street, Toronto, for Institute Members who desire to write about Mental Health Problems in their own families that are causing them concern.

Mr. Parks expressed the hope that Institutes would give thought as soon as possible, to the development of mental health programs for the coming twelve months.
