The Director's Report

Miss Anna P. Lewis brought greetings from the Women's Institute Branch and Home Economics Service. She reported that seven new branches had been organized in the past year: Balmoral in West Kent, Crown in West Simcoe, Paisley Junior in Bruce, Innerkip in Oxford, Little's Hill Coronation in South Simcoe, Kipling in Nipissing, Park Dale in Hastings. There are now 1503 Women's Institutes in Ontario with a membership of 45,457. Miss Lewis said that all through our Board sessions "Broader Horizons" have been stressed. We have been stimulated and inspired this summer through

our associations with our world organization, the A.C.W.W. A real challenge is ours and a great responsibility rests on the shoulders of our board members. "You have been chosen as board members because of your leadership qualities," Miss Lewis said, and because of the confidence and faith placed in you by your members back home.
