New Discoveries in Medicine. Another popular undertaking is installing First Aid Kits in schools and keeping them replenished. A great many Institutes have assisted with Tuberculosis Chest X-ray Surveys. Sebring-ville members canvassed about two thousand people in the district and acted as clerks and assistants on the day when eight hundred and fifteen people were X-rayed.

Recreation and cultural activities naturally overlap considerably in these reports. Blue Lake and Auburn reports a variety show with local talent under a professional director: They also consider the development of local talent at meetings an important cultural activity, and naving a member on the library board. Colpoy's Bay's cultural activities include good music at each meeting, sponsoring plays, having a lecture on Arts and Crafts by Thor Hansen. Park Head "secured a travelling library through their public library." ("We think this must refer to the county library's service of distributing books.") Many branches, including Reid's Corners list film showings among their cultural activities. Dunrobin sponsors a monthly showing of films open to the whole community, taking a silver collection to defray expenses. Blantyre put on a play "Where's Grandma?" which has been given twice and is booked for several more presentations. Waller's Falls sponsored a festival of school music for seven schools. Proton Juniors studied "education and etiquette." Phelpsencouraged singing at the meetings, exchanged good reading material and sent magazines to shut-ins. Chisholm "asked for music in the schools and got it." All the Institutes on St. Joseph Island seem to be supporting the Children's Library established by the Institute at Richard's Landing. Ouimet in Thunder Bay put on entertainments and raised \$500 toward a community hall. Edenhurst gave a piano to the school. Tiverton Junior Institute with the Junior Farmers put on a minstrel show; had a part in four homemaking clubs and sponsored a Junior Institute section at the fair. Melancthon sent a letter to the local paper protesting against holding a dance on Christmas eve and Christmas night. Honeywood reports an interesting debate on the subject "Each Generation Improves Upon the Past." Campania at one meeting had a suggestion box on "What I would like done in the community." As a result of this the walk from the road to the Institute Hall was gravelled and tile was put in-entirely a voluntary community effort.

A great many Institutes reported sponsoring girl's homemaking clubs affiliating with the local Federation of Agriculture, having members in farm radio forums. Several had had a member of the Junior Farmer's Association speak to them on Junior Farmer Work. A

mumber of Institutes arranged Hallowe'en parties for children. A few had paid an instructor for children's swimming classes. Many had provided or helped to provide a skating rink. A great many branches co-operate with the Children's Aid Society, especially in providing treats at Christmas time.

Burritt's Rapids has become "responsible for the local beach" and has provided a wharf, swings, life belts and first aid equipment. This Institute also provides street lighting for the village. Oxford Mills also pays for street lighting. Ravenna put kitchen equipment in the township hall and heavy wiring for the stove. Walter's Falls reports "We have had a lot of discussion on Hydro installation, working with the township council." Caledonia provides chaperones for the "Teens Canteen"

Seaforth Junior Institute organized a soft ball team and a debating team and put on a musical programme at the fall fair, also sponsored a Girls' Homemaking Club. Beckwith had music teaching started in their school. Pakenham maintains a library for the community, the members taking turns as librarian one night a week. Rideau had their district recreation director speak to them on how to start a recreation programme. They report "From this we have been able to organize a skeet shooting club for the boys, craft classes for the girls and folk dancing for all the young people. Coldstream maintains a rest room at the township park. A member is on the library board. A play was put on, raising \$244 for the Community Centre. \$25 was given to a family whose home was burned.

Many Institutes are members of their County Co-operative Medical Services and co-operate with the Federation of Agriculture in this and other projects. Union has participated in the Farm Forum and the Folk School. Burgessville is affiliated with the Farm Forum and the Federation of Agriculture. Most branches work with the Agricultural Society at Fair time. Saurin is co-operating with the Junior Farmers in putting a sign post at each concession road. Richview is affiliated with the Weston Local Council of Women. Drumbo entertained a neighboring Farm Women's Club, the visiting group providing the programme.

Among the rather unusual community activities reported: Aylmer started a fund to buy an artificial eye for a young immigrant. Norfolk Junior Institute co-operated with the Junior Farmers in a one night course on Rural Hydro. They had film showings of "Hydro on the Farm" for the men and "Hydro in the Farm Home" for the women. Marburg reports: "We put a good big Union Jack in the hall in such a way that no outside group can possibly remove it and cram it out of sight in a disused cupboard." Whitby has put a cupboard in the public library for articles to begin a museum. Derry West, Meadowvale and
