### CLOTHING CLUBS

# Being Well Dressed and Well Groomed

This study includes the care of clothes and the art of being well-groomed. Each member makes a white slip for herself and applies special finishes and trims.

# Cottons May Be Smart

Each member plans and makes a cotton dress becoming in colour, design and style. This teaches the selection of material; the use of commercial patterns, and finishes such as bound and worked buttonholes.

### What Shall I Wear?

Wardrobe planning is studied with emphasis on planning to get satisfaction from clothes and how to spend clothing money wisely. Each member makes a blouse that fits into her wardrobe and learns how to select clothes to suit her.

### Sleeping Garments

Each member plans, selects and makes a nightgown or pyjamas. She may also make a housecoat and bedroom slippers.

### Working With Wool

The characteristics of wool and wool materials are studied in order that club members may choose more wisely, know how to work with wool and give it the proper care.

Each member is required to plan, select and make a wool skirt or jumper.

# HOUSEFURNISHING CLUBS

## Clothes Closets Up To Date

Includes a study of adequate storage for clothes and the making of a garment bag, hat standard and cover, and laundry bag.

# Cotton Accessories for the Club Girl's Bedroom

Each member surveys her bedroom and plans and makes accessories for her room—chair pad, dresser scarf and bedspread.

# HOSPITALITY CLUBS

#### The Club Girl Entertains

Hospitality in the home and club are studied with emphasis on the planning and preparation of refreshments for various occasions — the afternoon tea, the party, family meals.

#### HOME DEFENCE CLUBS

# The Club Girl Stands on Guard

Public health services are studied and the importance of good health habits, safety measures and sanitation is stressed.

## GARDEN CLUBS

### Girls' Home Garden Clubs

The planting of and caring for a good garden is the basis of this project each year. It is a three-year program with special emphasis on one particular phase each year. These include the improvement of home surroundings, the storage of vegetables by various methods such as canning and freezing, and the use of vegetables in daily meals.
