C. Current History:

This section should record events transpiring in the community with accompanying pictures or copies of records with sources listed,

in order to preserve this information.

If a loose leaf book were used for the original history, pages could be inserted giving the current records. If a bound book were used for the original, references should be made in the current history to the original. The current history might be developed on separate sheets in loose leaf fashion, allowing the necessary margin to permit binding when sufficient material has accumulated.
