

Scholarships

BEGINNING this year the Canadian National Exhibition will award annually ten scholarships of \$750 each, one to go to each province in the Dominion to assist young Canadians in the study of home economics, agriculture and veterinary science.

Each province may select a boy or a girl for this award each year, the selection to be responsibility of the provincial Department of Agriculture. The schools eligible for the scholarships are a School of Home Economics, a recognized College of Agriculture or a Veterinary College leading to a degree or a School of Agriculture leading to a diploma. The candidate must be at least seventeen years of age and must have completed at least two years in 4-H Club work. Candidates must also have qualities of leadership and must have shown an interest in community activities.

This year the award for Ontario went to Julia Lane of Barrie Island, Manitoulin. Julia is the eldest of a fairly large family in a rural community. She has completed eight 4-H Homemaking Club units in Foods and Clothing, has had three years in a Garden Club and this past year has acted as a Garden Club leader. She sings in the church choir, teaches the primary class in Sunday School and has been president of her Church Young People's group. Julia has just passed her Senior Matriculation examination with a high standing. For some time she has had her heart set on taking the degree course at Macdonald Institute—now this scholarship makes it possible.
