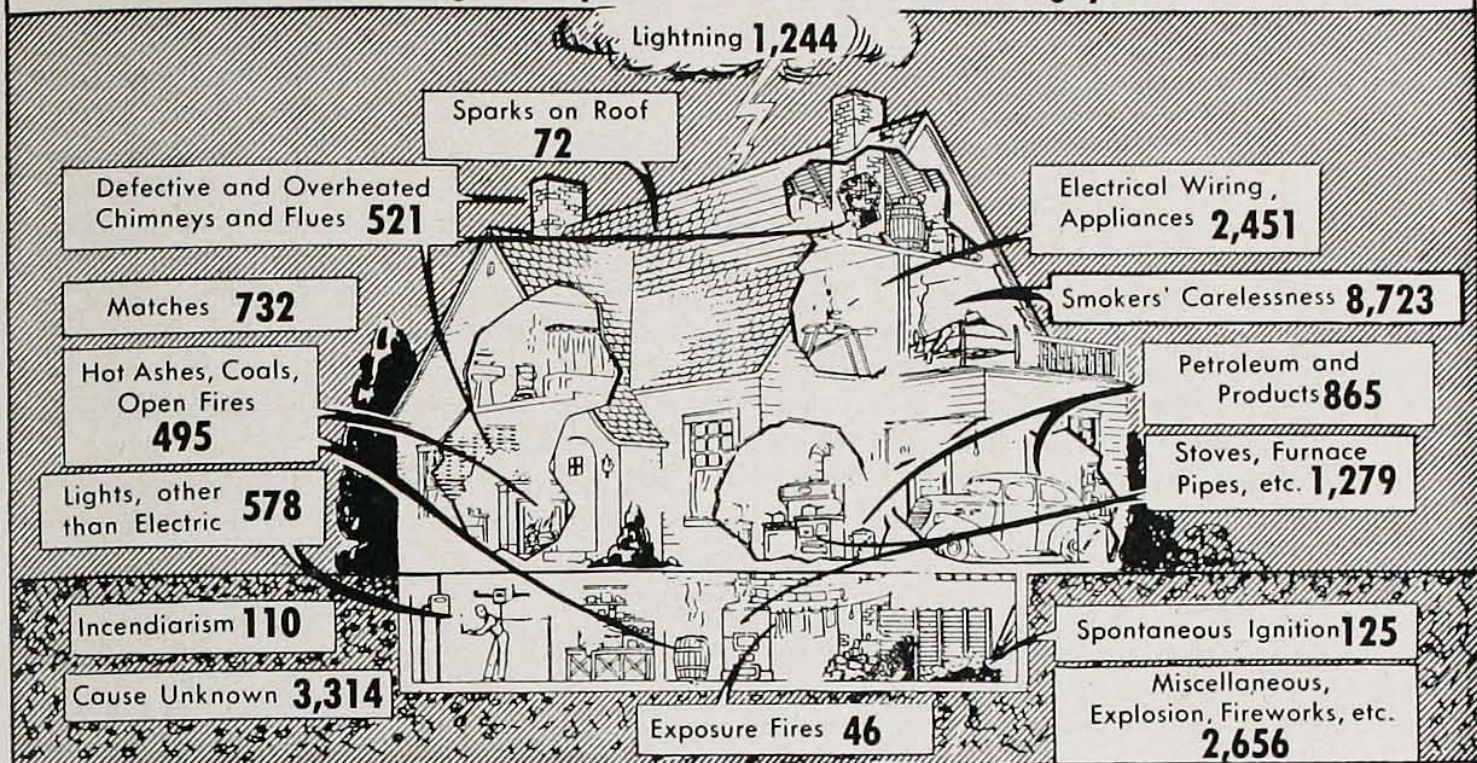


Here Are Fire Danger Spots

Fire Marshal's Office, 210 Huron Street, Toronto. Institutes might find ways of using it in an educational campaign for fire prevention in the home.

Threshing Outfits—If your thresher uses a steam engine see that he has a spark arrester **in place** and keep a goodly supply of water handy. Supervise the putting out of the fire under the boiler yourself. Keep a good-sized chemical fire extinguisher and plenty of water handy. If a straw-blower is attached, a sprinkler system will keep down the dust, prevent dust explosions and fires coming out of the blower mouth.

Smokers and Matches—You have sense enough not to smoke around the barn, but what about the hired man or the boy with the cigarette? Do not allow anyone helping around the barn to carry matches. They have been known to go through the threshing separator and cause fire in the straw stack. Every match can cause a fire.

Spontaneous Combustion—Oily rags, if kept in a confined place, may catch fire in a few hours. See that your fodder crops are cocked in the field until fully sweated, and that they are spread and levelled when being placed in the mow.

Gasoline—Under certain conditions gasoline is more dangerous than dynamite. Never use a flame light or spark anywhere near it.

Keep it outside and, if possible, underground. The exhaust of a gasoline engine is dangerous. Exhaust to the open air only. Remember—A careful person seldom has a fire; a clean, orderly place seldom burns.
