Replica of the scroll signed by Mrs. Haggerty and Mrs. Maynard and delivered personally by Mrs. Haggerty to the Governor-General to be forwarded to the Queen prior to her visit to Canada last October.

The scroll was designed by Paul Buchanan, employed by Public Relations Department, O.A.C. The heading includes a maple leaf in colours of the four seasons on a ground of brown and blue representing the earth and the sky. The initial G is in gold and incorporates the trillium, symbol of Ontario. The bulk of the message is sepia in colour except for "Queen Elizabeth II" which is blue.
