A COMMUNITY HOBBY SHOW

HIS report of a hobby show comes from Mrs. A. W. Hardy, a local leader in the extension service Rug Making project in Huron county:

"The Tiger Dunlop Women's Institute of Carlow sponsored their first Hobby Show in the Easter holidays this year. It was planned by the rug making class who had learned this art through Home Economics Extension Services to display their finished mats, also to show the arts and crafts of the people residing in our township.

"As the venture was entirely new here, no one had any conception of how it would turn out. Many were a little frightened and unsure. However, with the co-operation of all the Institute members and the exhibitors, it was an unqualified success. Many people were surprised to see what their neighbours did with their spare time.

"The Township Hall was decorated along the walls with some 32 hooked rugs all made by members at the Carlow and Auburn classes. Several beautiful quilts, crocheted table cloths, many crocheted and knitted articles, needlepoint and petitpoint constituted the needlework class. In crafts there were toys, dolls, felt work, artificial flowers, driftwood creations, metal and leathercraft, other types of rugs, millinery, shellcraft and oil paintings.

"A feature of the show was an exhibit done by a lady, 89, Mrs. Alex Young who covered an old water jug with putty, sticking to it old gadgets and curios she had collected through the years and painting it over with gold paint.

"The schools in the township exhibited the work they had done in arts and crafts during the year and several girls gave demonstrations of crafts such as foam rubber flowers and plastic sprays. Many of the adult exhibitors also demonstrated their crafts.

"The success of the venture was mainly due to the co-operation of the women working together in the enterprise. Mrs. A. T. Lamb is president of this Institute."
