The Minister of Agriculture, the Honourable W. A. Goodfellow, was host for the Ontario Government at a dinner held in honour of the F.W.I.O. Board at the Royal Hotel, Guelph, during the annual board meeting. Guests were introduced by Miss Helen McKercher.

Mr. Goodfellow paid high tribute to Mrs. James Haggerty, retiring president, and to Mrs. G. Gordon Maynard, retiring secretary-treasurer for their faithful service during their terms of office. He also expressed thanks to Women's Institute members for the work they are doing on the Farm Accident Survey. Mr. Goodfellow said he didn't think anyone realized that farm accidents were such a problem, but statistics show the accident hazard in farming is two and one half times greater than in industry. Farming is one of the most dangerous occupations and even in the homes the accident rate is very high. Something will have to be done about it. Assessment for Farmers' Workmen's Compensation is almost prohibitive because of the accident rate. "We are hoping to establish a Farm Safety Council,"
