Financial Report

In giving the financial report Mrs. Gerald Holder, Secretary-Treasurer F.W.I.O. said 111 districts out of 113 had reported 37,501 members, and 1,399 branches, a decrease of about 900 members. The two districts still to come should add 18 branches and 450 members. 4 new branches have been organized and three disbanded.

Mrs. Holder asked secretaries to mark cheques sent to F.W.I.O. "plus exchange" as the cost of exchange is not the same in all parts of the province. Because banks are charging exchange on all forms of American currency she asked that only Canadian currency be sent.

92 branches had sent requests for 176 recon-

ditioned radios from the Toronto Telegram. The amount received for the Adelaide Hoodless Home Fund is \$2,021.05. World Refugee Year receipts were \$6,712.76 from 736 branches and \$42.76 only had been received toward the F.W.I.C. Foundation Fund. Mrs. Holder was appointed to the Finance Committee.

Mrs. G. Gordon Maynard, past secretary-treasurer gave a final report of her work up to the time of it being taken over by Mrs. Holder.

Proposed Budget

The proposed budget for F.W.I.O. was presented by Mrs. Frank Rodger, a member of the Finance Committee. Proposed receipts \$19,795.00, proposed expenditures including special expenditures \$21,324.00, showing a proposed deficit of \$1,529.00. Special expenditures included \$1,000 for the Adelaide Hoodless Home Fund and \$1,000 for half A.C.W.W. Conference costs for 1962.

The explanation for \$1,000 to the Adelaide Hoodless Home Fund is as follows: The Board Members accepted the recommendation for payment of 10c per member toward the purchase of the Adelaide Hoodless Homestead. This now becomes an obligation and since the fund to date has realized less than one-half of F.W.I.O.'s
