## Comments and Recommendations

Gordon Lake: "We would like to encourage other Institutes to take the St. John Ambulance course and to give their girls a boost by sponsoring 4H Homemaking Clubs. The leader will learn as well as the girls."

Portland Royal: "As our Institute had sponsored 4H Homemaking Club work for sixteen years without taking much interest in it, the leaders suggested that the Institute put on a bazaar and tea and have the girls model the dresses they had made. This was a great success."

Falkland recommends having a visiting committee consisting of enough members to visit the shut-ins of the community every month or every two weeks. (Park Head reports having such a visiting committee.)

Holtyre: "An Institute member should be proud to be an Institute member and should be made to understand the meaning of the organization. Keep the members working but don't overload them. Have as many as possible visit other Institutes and attend district annuals and conventions."
