At Barrie Island a bookmobile brings books to the library at the local church and an Institute member acts as librarian for their distribution. Salford sponsors a deposit station for books from the County Library.

Thorndale bought paint and members painted the trim of the library. They organized a night school; hold an annual variety concert.

Edgewood Junior sponsored a community meeting featuring water safety.

Kipling is attempting to have a dental clinic come to the local school.

Gateway discussed children riding bicycles at night without lights or reflectors and sent a letter to the Chief of Police who replied that the police would watch for these offenders.

Kintore: At a meeting the need of supervised recreation was discussed. A committee was appointed and this committee invited everyone in the community to a social evening. At this meeting a Community Recreation Association was formed and supervised baseball was planned for the boys and girls. The plan worked successfully. During the winter they had euchre parties and bowling. Cornell held dances for their young people, euchres for the older ones.

Woodstock North: "We asked the township council about cleaning up a local cemetery and we had a wonderful response."

Culloden undertook the sponsoring of a local Boy Scout Troup. They say "We are very proud of our nineteen boys."

Belfountain Rockside provides instruction in square dancing at the local public schools, once every two weeks . . . Sent regular donations of home cooking to a family whose mother was absent through severe illness . . . Donated money for the care of a child with a serious asthmatic condition.

Cheltenham: "The Canadians, a square

dance group are the result of a party held for our young people four years ago. Since that time they have met every two weeks except during the summer months. These dances were arranged and chaperoned by Institute members." The report adds. "The Canadians have won several prizes in competitions and have appeared on television programs."

Fullarton finds its wiener roast and ball games very much enjoyed by the community. They also had three card parties for the community, a St. Patrick's supper and a family night.

Elm Grove sponsored St. John Ambulance courses, one in First Aid, one in Home Nursing.

Glen Gowrie assisted with square dancing at a social evening at the Ontario Hospital in London.

Belmont in Peterborough "helped five families whose homes had been destroyed by fire during the year." (We wonder if the Institute made any study of fire prevention? Ed.)

Nephton says "We are happy that we sent for a travelling library as the community is twenty miles from the nearest village library." They sponsored a Red Cross Water Safety Program and fifty eight children and six adults registered, the children getting swimming instruction five days a week during July. When the parents of a family were in hospital, the Institute put cooked food in the freezer for the children. Greenlane's health convener supervised the transportation of their children to the pool for swimming instruction.

Queen's Line purchased an old church to be used as a community centre; another of their services was to provide cod liver oil for school children.

Snake River sponsored a family night at the rink for the people of two school sections.
