This will be the first portrait of a woman to have this place of honour. The F.W.I.O. Board will make the arrangements regarding the painting of the portrait.

Suggested Revisions in Hand Book

It was recommended to the Board of Directors that the Hand Book be revised as follows:

That on page 13, another Sub-section be added to Section 17, to be numbered (3) to read as follows: "Where Life Membership is conferred at District level, the Branch is relieved of the payment of District fees for that member."

That on page 31, another Sub-section be added to Section 12, to be numbered (5) to read as follows: "The Branch shall be exempt from paying District fees for those members upon whom a District Life Membership has been conferred."

That a specified time be set by the Board of F.W.I.O. for a general review of the Bylaws at which time submissions would be received from members at any level of the organization, i.e., Branch, District, Area or Provincial. The Constitution Committee to review the Hand Book would consist of (automatically) the President, Secretary and the Di-

rector of Home Economics Service; and here members to be appointed, at least two to some from the Current Board.
