has two), York, Algoma, Thunder Bay, and in the District of North Perth. And the Convention Areas of Kingston and Ottawa have scholarships to be awarded to girls in the Area. Kent has a scholarship apart from the provincial plan.

International

Last year to mark the 65th Anniversary of the Women's Institute, the Federated Women's Institutes of Ontario started to raise \$50,000 to provide an annual International Scholarship of \$2,500. Because it offered a special opportunity, \$1,000 of this was given to help Miss Pearl Isaacksz of Ceylon with a year's study at Macdonald Institute. After this deduction the fund now stands at \$21,500. It is quite possible that some Ontario home economics graduate may sometime be awarded this scholarship to work for better homemaking in "developing" parts of the world as our own Jean Steckel of Waterloo County is doing now in Africa.

Altogether, the Ontario Women's Institute scholarships — district, county, provincial and international—represent an investment of over \$87,000. They also represent a steadily growing movement to help a girl toward an education that should mean the enriching of her whole

life.

The annual tuition fee for the TEREE-YEAR COMMERCIAL HORTICULTURE COURSE is \$147.00.
