tractive and impractical to use extensively," a resolution was passed asking that F.W.I.O. investigate the cost of having the crest made available already cut out.

Two emergency resolutions were sustained. One from the Ontario Food Council read: "Whereas the terminology indicating quality varies from product to product in the Canadian food industry, as for example red and blue brand as applied to the grading of beef; fancy, choice and standard for canned goods; grades A and B as applied to eggs; and whereas this creates confusion in the minds of the buying public, be it resolved that the Ontario Provincial C.A.C. recommend that Canada No. 1, Canada No. 2 and Canada No. 3 be the uniform grading terminology to be used throughout the Canadian food industry and that National C.A.C. be requested to approach the proper authority to bring about this change."

An emergency resolution from the London Area, North Oxford District, observing that the use of mineral based detergents is polluting our streams and rivers and interfering with the efficiency of sewage treatment plants; and that it will eventually imperil our very water supplies, asked F.W.I.O. and F.W.I.C. to join with other concerned groups to request the Water Resources Commission and the provin-

cial and national Departments of Health to introduce legislation to prohibit the sale of mineral based detergents.

Plans for A.C.W.W. Conference

Mrs. Lymburner outlined plans and arrangements for the next A.C.W.W. Conference to be held in Dublin September 14 to 24, 1965.

Deadline to place applications as part of the F.W.I.C. delegation headed by Mrs. James Haggerty with the F.W.I.O. office is September 30, 1964.
