Safety Program

Mrs. R. W. Yungblut, a member of the safety committee, reported that she had attended a session of the safety conference in Niagara Falls, sponsored by the Department of Transport.

Mrs. Vickruck, convener of the Committee on Safety reported on safety with people as a study in human relations. Previous goals in our safety program have been to save lives and to save people from physical hazards. We have witnessed an apathy and general disinterest in the other fellow, sometimes creating the impression he is not worth saving. The W.I.'s now face a new challenge-that of making each one of us realize the other fellow is worth saving, that we ourselves are worth saving. We must feel "safe" within a group before we can contribute our best. This program will not teach us the safety hazards of mobile equipment but it will assist us to understand ourselves and others more fully through a study of attitudes.

Mrs. Vickruck recommended films that will contribute to the safety programme "Eye of the Beholder"—a half-hour film produced by Canadian General Electric, and "Gateway to the Mind" a one-hour film produced by Bell

Telephone, Toronto. For further information concerning rentals write to either company. A Grade VII book "You and Others" would also give some ideas.

This safety program will end in March 1966, at which time the branch convener will send her report directly to the provincial convener. If no safety convener is appointed we suggest the committees of citizenship and education and of home economics and health work jointly on this.

Cultural Activities and UN

Branches do not have standing conveners for the above but FWIO has appointed secretaries to take care of these programs.
