## **Scholarships**

The Women's Institutes of Ontario have an investment of \$50,635.14 in an International Scholarship Fund and \$59,225.60 in funds to provide scholarships for girls in various counties and districts of the province. ## Home Economics Service

Miss Helen McKercher, Director of the Home Economics Branch of the Ontario Department of Agriculture thanked the Board Members for the support they give the extension services in home economics. She expressed her appreciation of the work of the County and District Home Economists, of the Agricultural Representatives who cooperate in promoting this extension work; of the women who personally lead 4-H Homemaking Clubs and those who organize the senior projects; of the Women's Institute Presidents and Secretaries who bring in women from outside the Institute membership to have the benefit of the services of the Department; and to Institute officers and members who see the needs of their community and try to meet them. The Director commented on some excellent convention program features growing out of extension courses such as a fashion show at the London Convention and a Block Printing project in one of the northern areas.
