Ontario Pollution Conference

Mrs. Small attended the Provincial Pollution Conference held in Toronto early in December. Pollution was dealt with under three phases — agriculture, municipal and industrial. It was generally agreed that agriculture suffers more from pollution by others than it contributes to pollution. The Conference focussed on air, water and soil pollution, and speakers emphasized that some action on pollution is being taken but a lot more is needed.

United Nations Secretary

Mrs. Percy Radbourne, United Nations Secretary, requested that each Board Director stress at District Annuals that a study on "Human Rights" is essential. She is preparing a panel discussion and a flip chart for the presentation of the Human Rights story and showing laws passed from the Magna Carta in 1215 in England and down through the years, and asks such thought provoking questions as: "Do we have equal rights in Canada?" "Do Indians and Eskimos have equal rights?" "Is there one law for the rich and one for the poor when the poor often do not know their own rights?" "Is it possible to infringe on rights of seller and renter?"
