Announcement was made at the Board Meeting that the American Association for State and local history voted a certificate of commendation to Mrs. R. C. Walker, St. George, Provincial Tweedsmuir History Curator, for her untiring efforts in local community history.

Mrs. Leonard Trivers, immediate Past President of F.W.I.O. has been asked to serve as a Director on the Ontario Food Council, a branch of the Ontario Department of Agriculture and Food.

The resolutions to be considered at the A.C.W.W. Conference in September were reviewed.

The Scholarship Committee ratified 24 District, County and Area Scholarships of \$100 each contingent on grade 13 results.

Mr. J. Babcock, Director of Alumni Affairs, addressed Board Members on progress at Macdonald Institute. Members voted to support Bill C204 concerning maternity leave for protection of women employees within federal jurisdiction. Branches will be urged to study such a bill and others especially those pertaining to legislation affecting women.
