Mrs. William G. Miller read the report of "The Ontario Women's Institute Story" Committee prepared by the Chairman, Mrs. M. Pardy. The work of writing the manuscript for this up-to-date history, the selection of pictures has been completed and the order of the material appearing in the book has also been decided. It will be printed by the T. H. Best & Company, Toronto, but the actual selling price is indefinite until the exact number of pages is known. Dr. Ethel Chapman has completed an edit of the book.

75th Anniversary Fund

The Secretary-Treasurer, Mrs. Wm. G. Miller, reported donations to the 75th Anniversary Fund set up to raise \$50,000.00 for expansion and facilities at Macdonald Institute, now College of Family and Consumer Studies, were \$46,592.19. Calculating the interest on the in-
