Scholarship Report

Mrs. Lorne Daniel reported on the Scholarship Committee Meeting held on Monday afternoon. Twenty-one Area, County and District Scholarships winners and alternates were ratified. Winners' names will be announced by Mrs. Wm. G. Miller, Provincial Secretary-Treasurer to the Chairmen of the local Scholarship Committees. Samples of the Certificates which will accompany Scholarship Entrance Awards and of the Dorothy Fitcher and Florence P. Eadie awards, were displayed.

Report of Board Directors' Meetings

In a novel presentation, "What is your pitcher rating?" or "What is your batting average?" Mrs. Austin Zoeller reviewed the reports from the Board Directors' meetings with their District Officers. She questioned, were the women willing to learn and ask questions? Did they leave the meeting feeling it was tremendous, and was their feedback with the officers, doing some of the things suggested? Mrs. Zoeller likened the Board Director to a pitcher throwing resource information out. She said, "It can't always be dead centre over the plate. Maybe you want to throw a curve so women can express their ideas or get members asking questions and gaining confidence."

Several of the Board Directors explained certain features of their particular meeting: Mrs. H. Noblitt — the use and misuse of Emergency Resolutions and encouragement on the value of resolutions; Mrs. Wilson Johnson — interesting discussion on plans for 75th Anniversary and the type of memento that could be available, a 4-H Club event, and a request that more emphasis be put on oldest Branches and not just the three oldest; Mrs. Cridwyn Lee — discussed feedback, advisability of support to our own organization and of a possibility of a bus trip to see the Lee Homestead; Mrs. S. Cawker — enthusiastic towards having the meeting with two-way communication getting ideas and giving, and most important to bring out the quiet person and develop non-participants; Mrs. G. Burnside — officers like to have something to see, so interesting displays help, urged need for use of potentials in Loan

Library and knowing resources available; Mrs. George Meredith said that being in a different situation geographically work of Board must be presented in a different way by making use of time at District Board of Directors' Meetings and sending out copies of exact information; Mrs. E. Emke — not as enthusiastic about Ontario Women's Institute Story as she would have hoped, since they felt too much time is spent looking back and emphasis should be put on looking forward; Mrs. Cecil Kellar — method was to send out letters because general meeting was not possible because of transportation distances.

Board Directors' Problems

The Board Directors felt a directive letter should go out with the Cultural Activities and United Nations Forms, instructions should be read first before any form is filled in; forms are all sent to Secretary-Treasurers and must be distributed to proper persons concerned. If Board Directors not invited to District Meetings in other Districts in her Subdivision, she should make it known that she would like to attend. Some District Presidents do not visit Branches but question was raised, "Do they invite her?" and if not she could say she would like to visit the Branches; Board Director must be liaison and contact District or Branch on such matters as Resolutions etc. Always continue to try to resolve any problems tactfully and to the best of one's ability.

International Scholarship

Correspondence and pictures have been received from Turkey telling about Miss Naghiya Salman, the young lady who has been studying midwifery through aid from our International Scholarship. Miss Salman has indicated that she would like to take further education after she has completed her midwifery training. The Federated Women's Institutes of Ontario have asked The Associated Country Women of the World for advice as it is under A.C.W.W. guidance that this young woman was chosen to receive our aid. Mrs. Ismet, Turkey, who has been our liaison, expects to attend the A.C.W.W. Conference in Norway and it is hoped that the Ontario delegates will have a chance to meet her and learn further of the good work of their International Scholarship.
