To The Branch Convenir:

All resolutions, except emergency ones, originate at the Branch. This fact should make the Branch Members aware of the importance of worthwhile resolutions. It is here that investigation into existing laws or conditions should be done.

1. Resolutions must have a useful purpose.
2. The subject must be definite and worthwhile.
3. The subject must be carefully studied from all angles.

There are two types of resolutions:

1. Local
2. Provincial, National or International

Information on the proper drafting of a resolution, required signatures, etc. is to be found in the Handbook page 69.

Whereas — gives the condition of the situation which the group is concerned and must be clear as well as to the point with proper wording.

Therefore be it resolved — ask the proper authorities for the change, or changes, desired.

On matters of local interest a Branch or group of Institutes may present its own resolution to the proper authorities but this resolution should be reported to show that this action was taken by the branch.

A resolution of Provincial National or International importance must be directed through the District and Area to the Federated Women's Institutes of Ontario.
