At the Council Meeting, President Mrs. Olive Farquharson, O.B.E. emphasized that a purpose of the meeting was to assess progress on the Oslo Conference theme, "Pathways to Progress." "It is important that we know all

what is going on," the President said.

It was reported that A.C.W.W. has new office quarters at Suite D, 5/51 Warwick Square, Victoria, London, S.W.1.V.2.A.J. England. The Suite contains 7 rooms on a second floor and a good sized room in the basement. It is served by an elevator, has a small kitchenette and an entrance hall. It is being newly wired and decorated. To finance the expense of setting up the new office some A.C.W.W. bonds were sold and a bank loan arranged, but help is needed from the Societies. Much appreciation was expressed for the generous donations of Pennies For Friendship and we are urged to keep them flowing.

1. Assistance to the National Association of Women's Institutes of West Malaysia for training courses in five centres with four hundred persons receiving training.

Assisted in leadership training courses organized by the Sarawak Women's Institute.

- 4. Contributions made to an A.C.W.W. Caribbean Seminar.
- 5. Individual awards made to two members of the Botswana Council of Women to study nutrition, mother and child care, handicrafts, leadership in community development in Monze Homecraft Training Centre in Zambia.
- 6. A contribution toward expenses of a course for rural women in the Monze Area.
- 7. Three students have been sponsored one in Fiji and one in British Honduras to attend the Oslo Conference who have made contributions in their work back home; and one in Jordan who worked in refugee camps.

- 8. Joint award with Indiana Farm Bureau Women's Department, U.S.A. to give a member of the Jamaican Federation of Women four months training in the University of West Indies.
- 9. Grant to a Society in Spain to help them organize evening classes in food and nutrition.

The Triennial Conference, 1974 to be held in Perth, Australia October 8-18 in Perth Concert Hall and smaller halls in the vicinity for smaller meetings.

Registration fee \$25.00.

Theme — A World to Share.

Forum subjects — (a) Home and Family (b) Health and Happiness (c) Man and Nature (d) Communication and Understanding.

A pre-Conference Seminar will be held with the heading "Leadership Training in Commu-

nity Development."
