

A.C.W.W. HANDICRAFT COMPETITION
— 1971-1974
SUBJECT

Class 1 A Wall Hanging — any medium — traditional or creative, not larger than 24 inches x 18 inches.

Class 2 A small article of Craft suitable for sale as a souvenir representative of the country of origin (this must not be pottery, however, because of the difficulty of posting).

Class 3 A Painting "Meal Time" — any medium — unframed and without glass, not larger than 24 inches x 18 inches.

RULES

1. Each Area will be responsible for pre-judging its entries. **Three** entries for **each** class may be chosen or nine entries in all. Send winning entries to F.W.I.O. Office, Fifth Floor, 1200 Bay Street, Toronto 185 by November 15, 1973.

2. Announcement of Results — Results will be announced shortly before the Conference in 1974.

3. Judges — an Australian panel of judges will be appointed.

4. Prizes — There will be 3 prizes for Class 1

3 prizes for Class 2

3 prizes for Class 3

Prize Money — First £7 (about \$17.00)

Second £4 (about \$10.00)

Third £2.50 (about \$6.00)

5. Special Note — Insurance for entries to the international competition is the responsibility of the Societies submitting the entries from the time they leave their point of origin until they return, but A.C.W.W. will be responsible for insuring the exhibits during their display at the Conference.

A.C.W.W. Essay Competition

Subject — "Folk Customs or Festivals"

Rules — 1. Entries must not exceed 1,500 words.

2. Entries may be written in ink or typed but **please** use **one** side of the paper only.

3. Send **3** copies of each entry to facilitate judging.

4. Submit your essay with full name and address of writer **and** the member of the A.C.W.W. Member Society (ours is Fed. W.I.O.).

5. Keep a copy of your work.

6. Copyright — The copyright of the essay submitted belongs to A.C.W.W. and the essay may not be made public in any form **before** the international awards are announced, and thereafter, the A.C.W.W. prize-winning essays may not be published without permission of A.C.W.W.
