Provincially, Mrs. Wilson served as a Board Director, 1954-57, on the scholarship Committee, represented Mrs. McPhatter at Southwestern and Hamilton Area Conventions and was in charge of organization and receptions in Southwestern Ontario for the tour of Dame Alice Berry, ACWW President.

TV surveys and evaluations have been her responsibility both Provincially and Nationally, as well as a CBC radio program in the North. Travel has added to her knowledge, when she was a delegate to ACWW, Ceylon, and the first Northern Canada Women's Institute Convention in Inuvik. As Mrs. Wilson says, "I have always tried to do the things that were asked of me, and am looking forward to being editor of the Federated News."
