Health Education.

Mental Stress.
The Causes and Treatment of Drug Addiction.
Food Hazards — contamination, additives, imbalance, scarcity.

## Men and Nature

Here's a great chance for all to join in. Members will form into groups under leaders to discuss four aspects of this subject:

Affluence, waste, pollution, re-cycling.

Population Pressures.

Development, versus preservation of man's gifts.

What can I do?

Each leader will give her group's findings after which there will be a general discussion.

Here we hope to have practical exercises in Communication and Understanding — another chance for all to join in.

Talking to Neighbours — a topic will be given at the time.
