For The Good of All Mankind

Members of twenty-one branches of Renfrew South District worked for two years to make up the \$3,000. Although it seemed impossible to make up this amount of money in three years, the response was so tremendous that a year before the deadline, the money was in the treasury.

The Maurice J. Grimes Lodge is a hostel for cancer patients of Eastern District who require treatment at the Ontario Cancer Treatment and Research Foundation Clinic, located at the Ottawa Civic Hospital. The operation of the Lodge is the responsibility of the Ontario Cancer Foundation; however, Cancer Society Volunteers help to provide extra amenities and services for the patients undergoing treatment.

The Lodge accommodates forty patients in well-equipped double rooms, with a lounge and TV room on each of the two floors of the building. Meals are provided in a fine cafeteria. Nursing staff is on duty at all times to tend the patients' needs. There is no charge to stay at the Lodge for any Ontario cancer patient, who lives twenty-five miles or more outside Metro Ottawa.

We feel that this has been a worthwhile project and already many from this area have stayed at this Lodge while undergoing treatment.

A cheque for \$3,000 was presented to Mr. Fred Bull, President of Eastern District of the Canadian Cancer Society. These funds are designated to furnish three bedrooms in the Maurice J. Grimes Lodge, Ottawa.

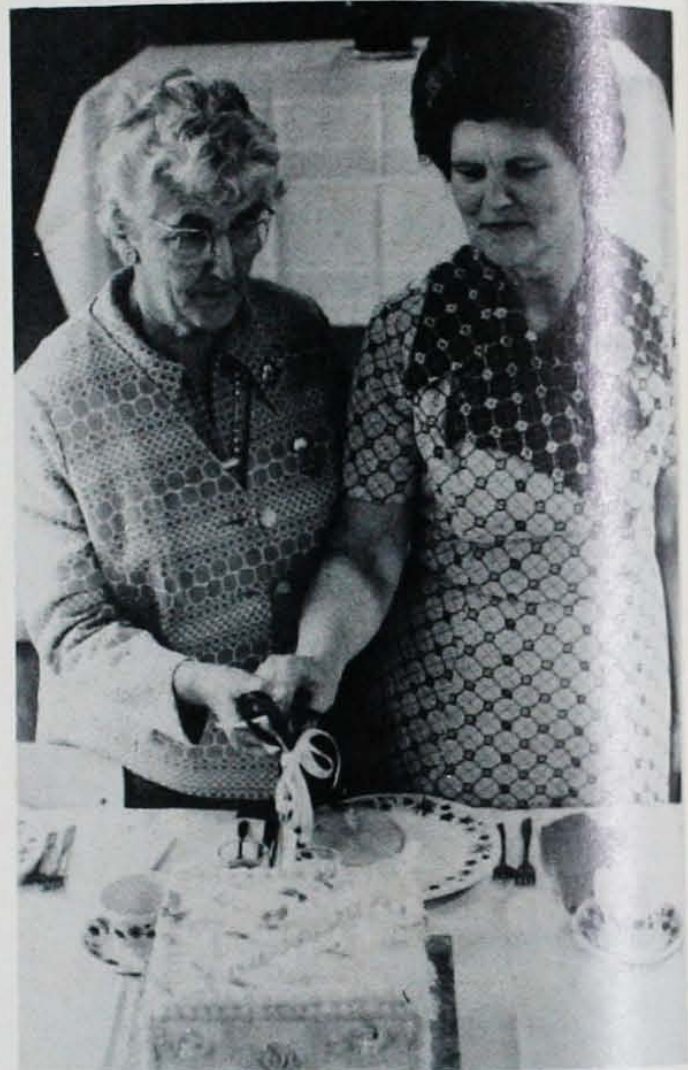
TWENTY-FIFTH ANNIVERSARY Peel North District
