Adelaide Hoodless was determined that girls should learn "about Home Economics" back at the turn of the century. She was so concerned that she approached Sir Wm. Macdonald, tobacco millionaire, from Montreal to build a school for girls to learn about Domestic Science. When he objected by saying he could not favour Ontario over Quebec, the story has been told, Mrs. Hoodless simply said "build a school in both Guelph and St. Anne de Bellevue." This he did and so Macdonald Institute was established at O.A.C. in Guelph and Macdonald College at Ste. Anne. There probably isn't a Branch in this Province who hasn't had a project to raise money for worthy students. The range is wide. Members have supplied the grade VIII graduation dinner, local awards to a special student in the lower grades at secondary schools, and awards, bursaries and scholarships to students going on to higher education.

The Women's Institutes have encouraged education and many children and grandchildren have benefitted.
