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Should the animals be allowed to take up human space? On a global basis at present rates we will not be able to feed the world population if livestock habits continue.

Dr. Stone agreed there are people who are hungry and short of protein but basicaly humans are meat eaters. You could take table grain away from livestock and feed to humans by further developing roughage crops and better use of by-products such as brewers grain. However, developing countries do not have dollars and still could not buy the cereal grains. When countries do have extra dollars—example Japan (basically rice eating, cereals and fish) now buy eggs, chicken and pork.

Dr. Rennie in summing up, pointed out both had taken extreme views "only to stimulate your thinking," providing factual information which he hoped would

make all more knowledgeable.

A question period followed. What about food wastage? feeding of pets? long term development of grass strains? misuse of herbicides? where will the livestock producer find money to grow enough crops if meat eliminated?

Technology is important but would be more so if we were to transfer from a livestock economy to a grain economy.

The need for new technology and the need to apply this information when it becomes available, along with the distribution of food are the greatest challenges, which face Agriculture. They must be dealt with and solutions found.

The availability of energy, the long term climate changes and its effect on production, along with a thought to maintaining proper balance for concern of clean environment and abundant food of good quality are the Horizons Agriculture must face. Dr. Rennie cautioned all as individuals, that challenges of tomorrow will always be present. Our lives are affected daily by national disasters, crop failures, energy shortages, regardless of where we live.
