The 4-H programme in Canada started in 1913 and has grown to a membership today of close to 80,000 young people involved in 6,000 clubs and aided by approximately 18,000 volunteer adult club leaders. Much credit for the growth and success of the 4-H programme must go to these leaders who have given substantially of their time and energy in giving direction and encouragement to the 4-H members.

In June 1977 a "4-H 500 Club" was established to attract large individual contributions to the Foundation and provide adequate recognition. The 500 Club is the name given a group of individuals prominent in 4-H and agriculture, who have contributed, or pledged to do so, a donation of \$500.00 to the Canadian 4-H Foundation.

The Canadian Council on 4-H Clubs is the national body charged with the responsibility of develop-

ing and carrying out the national and international aspects of the 4-H programme.
