DISPOSITION OF RESOLUTIONS EASTERN AREA

Because of the difficulty in obtaining a dental appointment it is felt there is a shortage of dentists—request Ontario Government to consider the situation with a view of finding a remedy.

"The Ministry of Health has been particularly aware for some years of the maldistribution of dentists within the Province of Ontario and the difficulty in some smaller towns and more remote areas to obtain dental services. Since 1970, one hundred and five dentists have been selected and placed in areas of the Province designated as underserviced. At the present time seventy-three private dental practitioners are located in a formerly underserviced area.

This program of providing financial support to dentists wishing to locate in a designated under-

serviced area will continue indefinitely.

I am also pleased to inform you that the Ministry of Health has purchased five additional Mobile Dental Units. We have been operating five Units for the past several years in the more remote areas of the Province, providing all preventive and basic treatment services to children residing in these communities at no direct cost to the parents.

This fleet of ten Dental Coaches will now enable us to more than double our efforts at treating children in the Province residing some distance from private den-

tal care.

Some sixty-five Medical-Dental Centres have been constructed by small communities in the past eight years. Many have-received government grants for the construction costs. These clinics have been most instrumental in attracting both physicians and dentists to the areas.

NORTHERN AREA

Small toys enclosed in cereal boxes unsafe for small children—request Department of Consumer Affairs to investigate.

A reply received from the Product Safety Branch of the Consumer and Corporate Affairs stated toys in cereal are regulated under the Hazardous Products Act and the prohibition of sales require a change in regulation. Their concern was with the quality of the toy and that we should approach the Dept. of Health and Welfare. To date no answer to our letter from either Hon. Marc. Lalonde or the Products Safety Branch.

Request Government to enact legislation to permit the spouse to receive payment for labour, deductible from spouse's income.

"As you know, the CRTC is not authorized as a censorship body, in view of the freedom of e sion requirement of the Broadcasting Act. Ho the Commission may make specific recommend to individual broadcasters at the time of their renewal. For example, the renewal decisions of a ber of television stations included the following ments:

"the licensee should exercise greater of the selection of foreign programs, partic those containing violent elements which the deep and legitimate concern of many resible citizens. The licensee should also exgreater discretion in scheduling such programs.
