TEACHING VALUES

Lynedoch WI, Norfolk South District

had educators speak at a Branch meeting. Mrs. Betty Chapman, principal of Lynedoch Elementary School and Mr. Graydon Jones, Vittoria Audio Visual Centre spoke and showed slides.

Mrs. Chapman gave a preliminary explanation of the methods used in our elementary schools to teach children good basic values during their formative years to enable them to become good, decent individuals, able to cope with the problems of everyday life in our swiftly changing world, and to become useful members of society.

Mr. Jones complemented Mrs. Chapman's address with a slide presentation of scenes taken throughout the area formerly known as Norfolk County. Many of these slides were taken in the elementary schools of the area.

Mrs. Chapman explained that teachers had always taught these intangible "values" but that they had never been written down or set out as a particular school "course".

The presentation graphically illustrated that although the teaching of moral values rests mainly with parents, teachers too have a certain responsibility to guide their students in basic values.
