SPOTLIGHT ON BREAD

Basic and more advanced techniques in preparing yeast products are featured, and the introduction of some metric recipes. The great variety of breads that can be produced will be a source of pride and satisfaction for the busy homemaker.

CONTEMPORARY TAILORING

Tailoring a jacket is not a difficult project anymore! Why not learn the quick and easy ways to obtain that professional look? The emphasis is on fusible interfacing and machine stitching to replace time consuming hand stitching. You'll enjoy the new tricks for bound buttonholes, patch pockets and other tailoring details.

NEEDLEPOINT FOR BEGINNERS

Learn the basics of needlepoint. As well as five different stitches, you are taught some of the aspects of needlepoint: working from graphs, kits, patterned stitches and original designs.

QUILTS

Experience the joy of this centuries-old art. The Quilts course takes you from making a template right up to quilting a block. It includes modern techniques along with design, color coordination and traditional quilting patterns.

The importance of nutrition and its relation to health is stressed. Advice on budgeting, economical shopping and menu planning are included as well as a demonstration on recipes for one or two.
