In preparation for the International Conference in Germany in 1980 all Area Vice Presidents will bring an ACWW flag to their countries from the Council meeting in England in June.

The flag for Canada will be brought back by Dr. McLean to begin its journey to all Constituent Societies in Canada. Mrs. McLean will give directives upon her return from England.

The flag tour is a method of promoting Pennies for Friendship and the aim is to raise 8½ million pennies as a jubilee gift to be presented at the 50th anniversary of ACWW at the Conference in Hamburg in 1980.

### RESOLUTIONS

- 1. To request the Canada Pension Plan be amended to permit the spouse that remains at home to contribute on a voluntary basis as a self employed worker.
- 2. To request that laws be amended pertaining to custody of children under the Divorce Act.
- 3. To request that the CRTC ban advertising of feminine hygenic products.
- 4. To request that advertising be banned on highly sweetened products for children under seven years, in order to avoid health hazards.
- 5. To request that the legislation be extended for 6 months on the allowance to a spouse of a deceased pensioner who was in receipt of old age security pension and supplement.
