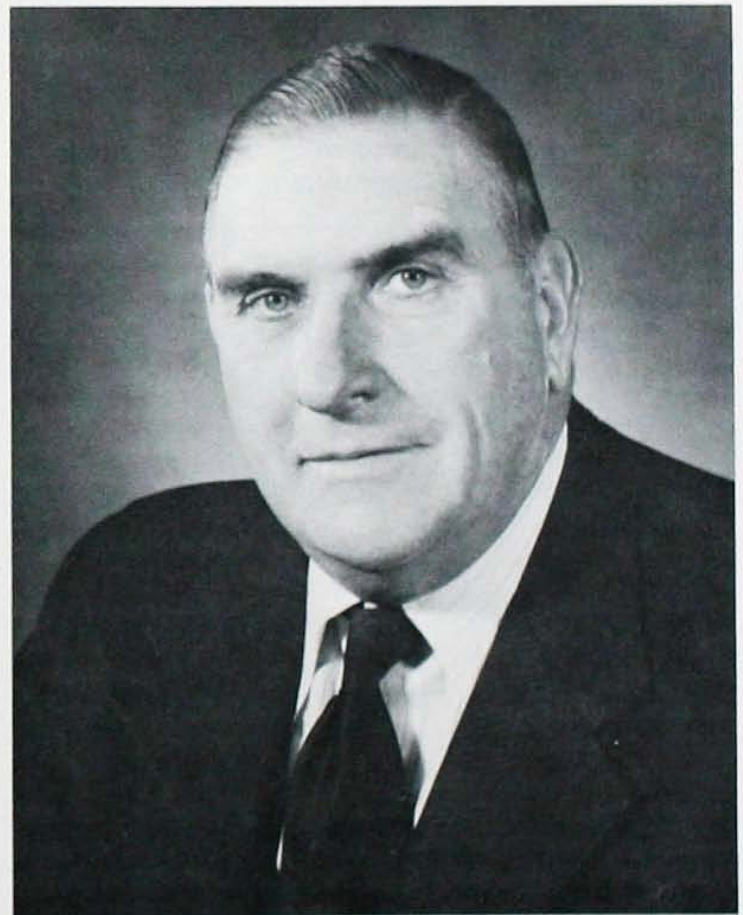
Because of this broad experience he was appointed as a Minister without Portfolio, Chairman of Cabinet and Minister of Government Services before moving to Agriculture and Food.
