## HERB COTTAGE CHEESE DIP

1 c plain cottage cheese

2 tbsp milk

2 tbsp chopped green onion

1/2 tsp seasoning salt

2 tbsp. finely chopped dill pickle

few grains cayenne or few drops tabasco sauce few grains pepper

Blend in a blender or beat with rotary beater the cottage cheese and milk. Combine with remaining ingredients. Chill. Makes 1<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> cups, 10 calories per tablespoon.

Parsley or chives may be substituted for the green onion. Other variations could be chopped canned

pimento or fresh green pepper; or use an herb-seasoned salad dressing mix for a change in seasoning.

For dipping, use raw vegetables such as carrot, turnip or celery sticks, cucumber fingers, green pepper strips.

This dip can also be used as a dressing for salad greens. Thin with milk if desired.
