Dr. Lim was confident of continued support well beyond 1979 for "IYC is the launching point for progressively improving situations for children in the years to come." "We are guilty of many errors and faults but neglecting the fountain of life is the worst," stated Dr. Lim as she quoted the oft repeated statement ending "his name is today."

Mrs. Raigh Roe, Australia, ACWW President, addressed Council Members and Visitors urging everyone to pursue the opportunity of sharing their talent. "There are those who wonder why we, the ACWW, are the builders in all countries, but the most vital area is that of raising families," she said. "As a person-to-person organization with projects and programs on a person-to-person basis and making what seemed impossible, possible, we can be proud of our organization." "Our membership, our involvement knows no boundaries if we are to have peace and security amongst us all." As Mrs. Roe told her audience of the development of endless programs which IYC has afforded some encouraging statistics quoted were that life expectancy in many countries has increased 37-47% and enrollment at school up 30-40%. "So we must continue," concluded Mrs. Roe, "children of today are the citizens of tomorrow and we are those whose hands hold and shape the magnificent little building blocks that are our children."

Open Day concluded with the launching of the ACWW World Flag Tour. Each Area Vice President was presented with an ACWW flag made by the Women's Institutes of the United Kingdom. This flag is to be taken throughout each Constituent Society in the Area publicizing the work of ACWW and collecting Pennies For Friendship. It is hoped that a grand total of at least one penny for each of the 8 1/2 million members in the world will be realized when the flags reach their final destination — the 16th Triennial ACWW Conference in Hamburg, Germany, May 1980.
