VALUE	\$500.00
ELIGIBILITY	Active W I member for past five years.
PURPOSE	To take training to further education or qualifications in areas related to cultural activities, to benefit both self and community.
REGULATIONS	Applicant shall submit a letter of application which should contain the following information:

- personal data, relating to application
- need for financial assistance
- purpose and plan for which the money will be used, i.e. training, travel, accommodation
- outline of training program
- expected benefits from the proposed training to self and community.

Cultural activities to be interpreted as painting, music, drama, creative writing, creative heritage crafts, and the like.

Instruction should begin within six months of notification of scholarship and terminate within thirty months.

A **letter of recommendation** is required from local branch, to include detailed involvement in branch activities by the applicant.

Application to be received by FWIO office by February 1, 1981.

Successful applicant to be recommended by FWIO and application forwarded by FWIO to Scholarship Committee Chairman FWIC.

Successful applicant to be notified by the Chairman by April 15, 1981, official announcement at June Board meeting of FWIC.

 - Who told the story, i.e. mother, grandmother.
