ETHEL CHAPMAN

BORN: 11/20
1888-1974

Born within the walls of the Culture, Ethel Chapman began her career as a teacher in 1908. Educated at Kitchener, she graduated from Macdonald Institute in 1915, and took a position with the Women's Bureau Branch of the Ontario Department of Agriculture for 17 years. In 1927 she became editor, Home Division, of "Ontario Magazine", and in 1932, editor of "Home and Family". For the Federated Women's Institutes of Ontario, Ethel Chapman authored the book, *How to Succeed with New Residential Influence on Rural Homes*. She also served on the Curriculum Committee, Macdonald Institute, and on the Board of Directors of Federated Colleges, Kitchener. Her efforts were recognized by an Honorary D.L.L.B. from the University of Guelph in 1966, an Honorary Doctorate in 1976, and the Ontario Federation of the Federated Women's Institutes in 1976. Board Members will long remember Ethel Chapman for her success and contributions both for the welfare of rural families.
